

REVISION OF THE NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION (NSF) GRANT GENERAL CONDITIONS (GC-1) EFFECTIVE February 25, 2019

Effective February 25, 2019, new NSF grants and funding amendments to existing NSF grants made to for-profit organizations (other than Small Business Innovation Research/Small Business Technology Transfer grantees) and State, local and Tribal governments, will begin referencing and are subject to the *Grant General Conditions* (GC-1) dated 02/25/19.

Unless otherwise noted in a specific article, the *Grant General Conditions* apply to all new NSF grants and funding amendments to existing NSF grants awarded on or after February 25, 2019 to for-profit organizations (other than Small Business Innovation Research/Small Business Technology Transfer grantees) and State, local and Tribal governments.

Significant Changes

- **Project Changes, Article 8.** This article has been revised for consistency with the Uniform Guidance. The grantee is required to obtain NSF prior written approval for any project change (such as subawarding or transferring part of an NSF award after an award has been made) specified in Article 2, Prior Approval Requirements. The language in Article 1.d.4 also has been revised to reflect this change.
- **Fee Payments, Article 47.** This new term and condition addresses when payment of fee is allowable for NSF awards.

Clarifications and Other Changes

- **Overall Document.** Throughout the document, websites and references have been updated for consistency with the *Proposal and Award Policies and Procedures Guide* and to reflect current information.
- **Prior Approval Requirements, Article 2.** Specific examples of coverage that is addressed in the prior approval matrices has been removed from GC-1.
- **Equipment, Article 6.** References to types of organizations and title to equipment has been clarified to reflect applicability of the provisions.

• **Project Reporting Requirements, Article 15.** This article has been updated to include language stating that the submission of the Final Project Report and Project Outcomes Report for the General Public (POR) indicates that the research on the project is completed.
