Daniel J. Hicks is a philosopher of science, ethicist, and social scientist specializing in public scientific controversies. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Notre Dame in 2012, and from 2013-2015 was a postdoctoral fellow in the Rotman Institute of Philosophy at the University of Western Ontario. In 2015-2016, Dan served as an AAAS Science and Technology Policy Fellow in the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Chemical Safety for Sustainability program, where he worked on the scholarly and public reception of the use of systems biology for regulatory toxicology. At NSF, Dan is hosted by the National Robotics Initiative in the Directorate for Computer and Information Systems, where he works on emerging ethical issues surrounding self-driving cars. Dan has published or has active research projects on controversies including genetically modified foods, vaccines, chemical safety, and obesity.
