Quincy Brown is an AAAS Science & Technology Policy Fellow at the National Science Foundation in the Division of Computer and Network Systems, Directorate for Computer and Information Science and Engineering (CISE/CNS). She earned her Ph.D. in Computer Science from Drexel University. She is a recipient of the Computing Community Consortium (CCC) CI Fellows Postdoctoral Research Fellowship award and was a National Science Foundation GK-12 and Bridges To the Doctorate Fellow. As a GK-12 Fellow she taught and developed STEM curricula for middle school students.

Prior to the fellowship, she was an Assistant Professor of Computer Science at Bowie State University. Her research interests include Mobile HCI, CS Education, and Broadening Participation in Computing. In 2011 she founded Girls Who Will, a summer program for middle and high school girls. Each summer girls engage in activities including game design, mobile app development, wearable computing, and 3D printing.

Through her research she seeks to identify methods of facilitating human interaction with advanced technologies, including mobile devices, to support learning. Her current projects include exploring the ways in which young children use touch and gesture interactions with mobile devices, first responders use of mobile devices during emergency evacuations, and modeling inquiry behaviors on mobile devices.
