David Trinkle is the Director of the Berkeley Research Development Office, where he and his staff help campus faculty and programs identify and apply for research support. Dr. Trinkle also advises the Vice Chancellor for Research, deans, and faculty on federal funding, strategy, and policy issues. As staff for the White House Office of Management and Budget from 2000 to 2007, he was responsible for National Science Foundation and government-wide R&D. As NSF's examiner, he framed budget and policy decisions, oversaw NSF budget execution and performance assessment, authored the NSF chapter in the President's budget each year, and contributed to NSF's strategic plan for 2006-2011. In his role as OMB's lead R&D examiner, he oversaw federal R&D data collection and analysis, staffed cross-agency R&D performance and funding initiatives, and authored the R&D chapter in the President's budget. He performed policy research at the RAND Corporation from 1992 to 2000 in areas including federal R&D priorities, public-private technology partnerships, and satellite communications. He was an engineer at the Aerospace Corporation from 1988 to 1992. Dr. Trinkle received a Ph.D. in Policy Analysis from the RAND Graduate School of Policy Studies, an M.S. in Electrical Engineering from the University of Southern California, and a B.S. in Systems and Control Engineering from the University of California, San Diego.
