

Ernst R. Berndt is the Louis E. Seley Professor in Applied Economics at the MIT Sloan School of Management, Co, and Co-Director of the Biomedical Enterprise Program at the Harvard-MIT Division of Health Sciences and Technology. He is also the Director of the National Bureau of Economic Research Program on Technological Progress and Productivity Measurement. Until recently, he served as Chairperson of the Federal Economic Statistics Advisory Committee, an interagency advisory panel established by the Bureau of Economic Analysis, the Census Bureau and the Bureau of Labor Statistics. He has served on the editorial boards of numerous peer-reviewing journals; currently he is a member of the editorial board of Health Affairs. Professor Berndt earned a Ph.D. degree in economics from the University of Wisconsin - Madison in 1972, and was awarded an honorary doctorate for his research on productivity measurement from Uppsala University in Sweden in 1991. Much of Professor Berndt's recent research has focused on price, output and outcomes measurement in the health care industries, and on regulatory policies at the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.
