

Janet A Harkness is a cross-cultural survey methodologist with expertise in instrument design, adaptation, and implementation. She has a multi-disciplinary academic background and training - comparative medieval studies (MA); linguistics, cultural anthropology (PhD); and extensive experience in survey methods and cross-national survey research, having being affiliated over 15 years with the International Social Survey Programme, a member of the European Social Survey central coordinating team from its inception till 2008, and a consultant or PI on other large cross-national projects, both basic research and survey projects. She has held the Donald and Shirley Clifton Chair in Survey Science at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 2005 and became Director of the Survey Research and Methodology Program at the UNL Gallup Research Center in 2006. She has published, presented, and taught on numerous aspects of cross-cultural survey research and cross-cultural communication. She is chief editor of *Cross-Cultural Survey Methods* (John Wiley, 2003) and *Multinational, Multiregional and Multicultural Survey Methods* (John Wiley 2010). Her Master's degree from Edinburgh University was in Comparative Medieval Studies; she received a doctorate in English, Linguistics, and Cultural Anthropology, from Freiburg University, Germany. She became a Descartes Laureate of the European Union through her work in the European Social Survey in 2005.
