

Hilary Hoynes is a Professor of Economics at the University of California, Davis and the co-editor of the *American Economic Review*. She joined UC Davis after eight years at UC Berkeley, received her undergraduate degree from Colby College and her PhD from Stanford University.

Hoynes specializes in the study of poverty, inequality, and the impacts of government tax and transfer programs on low income families. Current projects include evaluating the impact of the Great Recession across demographic groups, examining the impact of the Earned Income Tax Credit on infant health, and estimating impacts of U.S. food and nutrition programs on labor supply, health and human capital accumulation. Her work has been funded by the National Institute on Aging; the National Institute for Child Health and Human Development; the U.S. Department of Agriculture; the Institute for Research on Poverty; and the Joint Center for Poverty Research. In addition to her faculty appointment, Hoynes has research affiliations at the National Bureau of Economic Research and the Institute for Fiscal Studies, and was recently appointed to the National Advisory Committee of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Scholars in Health Policy Research Program.
