

John Leslie King is W.W. Bishop Professor of Information and Vice Provost at the University of Michigan. He studies the relationship between technical change and social change, aimed at improving the design of information technologies for both organizational and institutional usability. Recent and current projects focus on the role of technical and institutional forces in the co-evolutionary development of intermodal transport and logistics, case management in felony criminal courts, global wireline and wireless telephony, the transition of the automobile industry from product to service sector, and the transformation of higher education. He holds a PhD from UC Irvine, an honorary doctorate in economics and business from Copenhagen Business School, and is a Fellow of both the Association for Information Systems and the American Association for the Advancement of Science.
