

David Poeppel is a Professor of Psychology and Neural Science at NYU, where he supervises the Center for Language, Speech, and Hearing (CLaSH@NYU). The research in his laboratory uses techniques from cognitive neuroscience to understand how speech perception and language comprehension work. Trained at MIT in cognitive science, linguistics, and neuroscience, Poeppel did his post-doctoral training at UCSF where he focused on functional brain imaging. Until 2008, he was a professor at the University of Maryland College Park, where he ran the Cognitive Neuroscience of Language laboratory. He has been a Fellow at the Wissenschaftskolleg (Institute for Advanced Studies Berlin) and The American Academy, a guest professor at many institutions, and received the DaimlerChrysler Berlin Prize and other honors. He is a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.
